Peach Confirms March Flight Schedule

Application Submitted for Flight Approval to Congested Airports

OSAKA August 23, 2011 - Peach Aviation announced today the confirmation of their domestic flight schedule for the period between March 1 and March 24. Starting on March 1, there will be 3 round trip flights per day for the Osaka (Kansai) – Sapporo (Shin-Chitose) route and 4 round trip flights per day for the Osaka (Kansai) – Fukuoka route.

Peach Aviation has applied to the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport for congested airport flight approval in accordance with Japan’s Aeronautics Act.
